1955 Sahu Shanti Prasad Jain buys BCCL from his father-in-law Ramkrishna Dalmia.



1959 Femina, magazine for women, is launched.



1961 The Economic Times, No. 1 business newspaper in India, is launched.

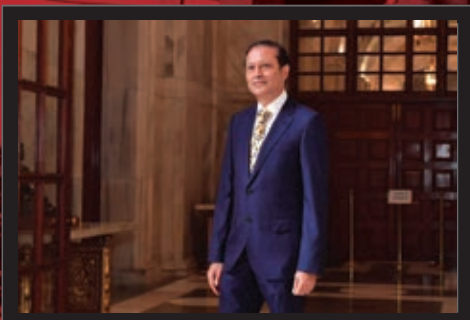
1962 Marathi newspaper Maharashtra Times is launched.



1964 The first Miss India pageant is held. This became a pathbreaking platform for women's empowerment, especially when it was telecast across the country in later years.

1994

Vineet Jain conceives of and launches TOI's trailblazing entertainment and lifestyle supplements namely Bombay Times, Delhi Times, etc. They were the first of their kind by any newspaper in the world and became a template for others.

1996

Launch of economictimes.com - ET's news website and timesofindia.com - TOI's news website - the Group's first foray into the Internet, as conceived of by Vineet Jain, followed by Indiatimes.com a year later.

1998

In a major initiative for a media company, the group launched Times Music which currently owns ~45,000 musical tracks across genres.

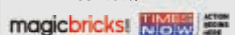

It promotes transparency, resolves disputes, and fosters cooperation among nations to strengthen the global economy. As participants, you will have the opportunity to grapple with real-world legal dilemmas, hone your advocacy skills, and immerse yourself in the intricacies of international treaties, conventions, and case law. The III CTIL - Bennett International Moot Court Competition promises to be a trailblazing event that fosters intellectual growth, cross-cultural understanding, and a profound appreciation for the significance of international law.



COMPETITION RULEBOOK

1. DEFINITIONS

The following terms shall have the corresponding meanings unless otherwise specified:

1. 'Competition' shall refer to III CTIL - Bennett International Moot Court Competition, 2026.
2. 'Competition Problem/Moot proposition' shall refer to the facts and issues released by the organizers of the Competition with its clarifications and corrections.
3. 'Competition Rules' shall refer to the official rules of the Competition as amended from time to time.
4. 'IST' shall refer to Indian Standard Time.
5. 'INR' shall refer to Indian Rupee.
6. 'Knock-out round' shall refer to the Quarterfinals, Semi-finals, and Final round of the Competition.
7. 'Memorial' shall refer to the memorandum of written submissions submitted by any participating team as per the Competition Rules.
8. 'Organizing Committee' shall refer to the committee appointed for the administration and conduct of the Competition, including any other authorized persons, and of all events leading up to the Competition.
9. 'USD' refers to the United States Dollar, which is the official currency of the United States of America.
10. 'SAARC' refers to the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation.
11. 'Official Email' shall refer to the official email id of the Moot Court Committee, Bennett University, i.e., bnmcc@bennett.edu.in

2. ADMINISTRATION AND CONDUCT OF THE COMPETITION

- a. The III CTIL- Bennett International Moot Court Competition 2026 is administered by the CTIL & Moot Court Committee, School of Law, Bennett University (here in after 'Organizing Committee').
- b. The competition will be held from February 6-8, 2026, at Bennett University, Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh, India in Offline Mode

3. ELIGIBILITY

The competition is open to:

- a. Students enrolled in 5-year integrated law programmes or 3-year LL.B. programmes across India and 4 Year or 5 Year Integrated Law programmes abroad.
- b. Each team shall consist of 2 Speakers + 1 Researcher.



General Instruction:

- a. Teams are to notify which members are the respective speakers and researcher. No change of speaker to researcher or vice versa shall be permitted except upon application to the organizing committee.
- b. The request for change should have concrete reasons, and the decision of the Organizing Committee shall be final. If necessary, the Organizing Committee holds the right to disqualify a team upon finding the reason for change to be unjustifiable or unreasonable.
- c. No team shall contradict the composition mentioned above. No faculty member, coach, or a designated observer will be allowed to accompany the team.
- d. No pickup and drop-off facility will be provided by the institution. The participants are requested to arrange their own transportation for the same.
- e. A violation of the prescribed Code of Conduct will invite sanctions, which will be decided by the Organizing Committee.
- f. Teams must behave with other team members and the Judges / Organizers/ Volunteers in a dignified manner.
- g. Teams should not attempt to influence Judges / Organizers in any manner.
- h. Participants are expected to maintain decorum in the courtroom during the Competition and to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the legal profession.
- i. The teams should not engage in any form of unethical, unprofessional, or wrongful conduct during the entire period of the Competition.
- j. Participants should not indulge in the consumption / carrying of drugs / alcohol / arms or ammunition / immoral / illegal activity or any other forms of taste/addiction during the Competition.
- k. If participants are taking accommodation, they will not be allowed to leave the campus after arrival, till Valedictory Ceremony on 8th February 2026

Dress Code:

Participants shall strictly adhere to the following dress code: -

Men - Black Formal Coat, White Shirt, Black Tie, Black Formal Pants, White Socks, Black Formal Shoes.

Women –

(A) Black Formal Coat, White Shirt, Black Tie, Black Formal Pants, Black Formal Shoes.

OR

(B) Black Formal Coat, White Shirt, Black Tie, Black Skirt, Black Formal Shoes,

OR

(C) Black Formal Coat, White Long Kurta, White/Black Salwar, White Dupatta, Black Formal Shoes

Language and Structure:

- a. Oral and Written submissions shall be in English language only.
- b. The competition will include two preliminary oral rounds and advanced rounds, i.e., Quarterfinal, Semi-Final, and the Final Round.
- c. There is a limit of 40 teams for the competition. Teams will be registered on a first come, first-served basis. Subject to change by the decision of Organizing Committee.



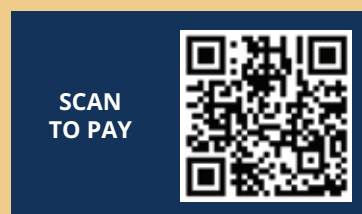
Registration and Fee

- Teams shall register for the competition on or before 23:59 Hours 5th December 2025, by sending an email with the subject 'Registration for the III CTIL - Bennett International Moot Court Competition 2026 to bnmcc@bennett.edu.in after completing the online registration form.
- The registration fee for the competition for Indian Teams 7500 INR and International Team is 100 USD and SAARC Region is 50 USD per team (including accommodation on a sharing basis and food).
- Accommodation and Food will be available at the university for three days i.e. 6-8 February 2026, any further extension beyond these dates will be chargeable.

- A scanned copy of the Bona-fide Certificate of the Head of the Institution/Principal/Head of the Department/Dean certifying that the team consisting of the three members are bona fide students of the respective institution is to be uploaded through the online registration form and also be submitted in hard copy while final registration on 6th February 2026
- Teams will be assigned a team code after registration. All communication thereafter will be through the team codes, and teams are not to mention any other details to the Organizing Committee till the completion of the competition.
- While filling out the Registration Form, the teams must choose a primary contact person, alternatively called a 'Point of Contact' ("POC"). All communications concerning the Competition will be sent by e-mail to the nominated contact person.
- The registration fee once paid is **non-refundable** in all circumstances.

- a. Teams are strictly prohibited from mentioning their personal details anywhere in the memorial.
- b. After submission of memorials, no revision, supplements, or additions shall be allowed.
- c. Teams must strictly adhere to the mentioned structural format.
- d. The Title/Cover page shall include:
 - i) The Team Code on the upper right-hand corner of the cover page
 - ii) The name and place of the forum
 - iii) The relevant legal provision under which it is filed.
 - iv) Name of the parties and their status
 - v) Memorial Filed on Behalf of complainant/Applicant- BLUE.
 - vi) Counsel Appearing on Behalf of Defendant/Respondent- RED.
- e. The criteria for evaluation of Best Memorial are as follows-

5. STRUCTURE OF COMPETITION

The Competition shall consist of following Rounds:

- i. Researcher Test.
- ii. The Preliminary Rounds. (I & II)
- iii. The Quarter Final Rounds.
- iv. The Semi Final Rounds; and
- v. The Final Round.

The side on which the Team will be arguing will be decided by a draw of lots in presence of all the teams

6. MEMORANDUM

- A. Each registered team will submit **six** hard copies of memorials of each side on the date of final team registration on **6th February 2026**
- B. Soft copies of the memorials must be submitted via this link <https://forms.gle/rRnnpCdRTLsy8z8cA> no later than 15th January 2026
- C. The memorial files should be either in .doc, .docx or .pdf formats with the file names as Team code- Party. For e.g.: - BITC001-COM or BITC001-RES and hard copies of memorials must be submitted by the teams living across the country through the process of courier
- D. Any memorial submitted after the deadline shall be subject to penalty for late submission till January 20, 2026

7. RESEARCHERS' TEST

- a. Researchers' Test will be held in offline mode only on **6th February 2026**. The test will consist of multiple-choice questions based on the moot proposition and relevant legal provisions. Only the researcher in each team is permitted to participate in the Researchers' Test.

8. PROCEDURE FOR ORAL ROUNDS

- a. The oral rounds will consist of two preliminary rounds followed by the quarter-final rounds, semi-final rounds, and the final round on a knockout basis.
- b. The oral rounds will be in offline mode for the national teams and international teams can choose any mode for competition either online or offline.
- c. The draw of lots for the preliminary rounds and exchange of memorials will be held on 6 February 2026.
- d. The preliminary rounds and quarter-final rounds will be held on 7 February 2026 wherein each team shall argue for the allotted side (Complainant or Respondent).
- e. The complainant and respondent will first submit their arguments, followed by rebuttals and sur-rebuttals.
- f. Each team will get a total of 30 minutes to present their case during the rounds, followed by three minutes per team for a rebuttal or sur-rebuttal.
- g. Rebuttals and sur-rebuttals are limited to issues raised in the arguments raised during the oral rounds by the opposing teams.
- h. Teams can choose the division of time per speaker at their discretion. However, each speaker must speak for a minimum of twelve minutes.
- i. Oral arguments are limited to issues disclosed in the moot proposition.
- j. Teams may submit a compendium of cases, scholarly articles and papers, and statutory provisions to support their arguments during the oral rounds.
- k. Use of any electronic gadgets is not permitted during oral rounds.
- l. The top eight teams from the preliminary rounds based on the scores in the preliminary round will qualify for the quarter-final to be held on 7 February 2026. There will be a draw of lots for the quarter-final after announcing the qualifying teams.
- m. The winner of each round in the quarterfinals will qualify for the semi- finals to be held on 8 February 2026. The draw of lots for the semi-finals will take place following the declaration of results of the quarter-final rounds.
- n. The winner of each round of the semi-finals will qualify for the finals on 8 February 2026. The winner of the finals will be declared the winner of the III CTIL-Bennett International Moot Court competition 2026.
- o. The criteria for scoring of the oral arguments are as follows-

Plagiarism and scouting in any manner are strictly prohibited, and teams or any member thereof found indulging in the same shall be disqualified from further participating in the competition. The Organizing committee will take the final decision regarding any matter pertaining to scouting.

The decision of the Organizing Committee concerning the deduction of marks based upon the percentage of plagiarism in the memorials will be final. Any memorial with more than 10% plagiarism and AI will result in the disqualification of the team from the competition. The medium to check for plagiarism will be Turnitin.

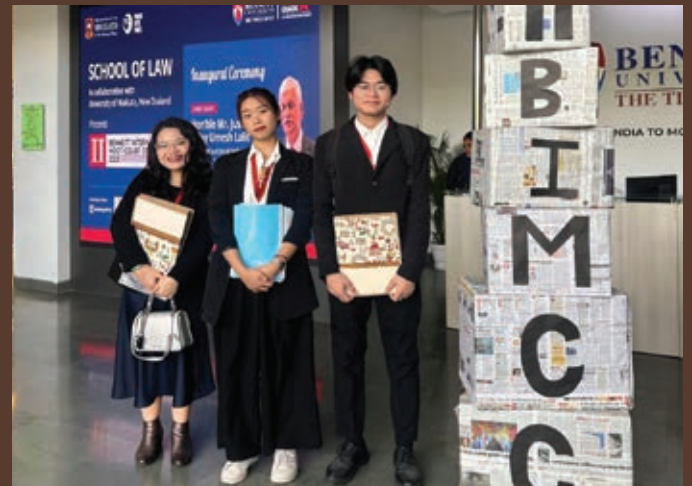
