2. COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course is part of the specialized knowledge block within the Bachelor of Law program, specializing in International Trade Law.

International law on trade in Goods is a subject that studies legal relations between countries in the field of international trade in goods. The purpose of this course is to provide students with fundamental legal knowledge about international trade in goods. Additionally, the course enhances students' abilities to analyze, evaluate, and apply this knowledge to resolve disputes in the field of international trade in goods.
