#### 2. COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course is a core component of the specialized knowledge block within the Bachelor of Laws program, focusing on International Trade Law.

It is designed to equip students with advanced knowledge of the legal frameworks regulating international law on trade in services under the WTO system and bilateral and regional FTAs. The course aims to refine students' analytical and evaluative skills, enabling them to interpret and apply legal provisions, including Services Schedule to effectively address and resolve disputes in the realm of international trade in services.
