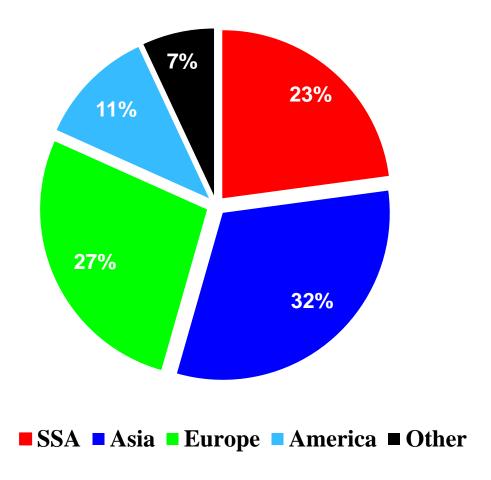

## 1.1 BACKGROUND AND MOTIVATION

## 1.2 RESEARCH QUESTIONS AND AIMS

#### Overall aim

> Evaluate South Africa's utilisation of sustained export potential in SSA

## Secondary aims

- > Determine which markets offer consistently large and/or growing import demand in SSA over a five-year period from 2010 to 2014
- > Determine which products South Africa consistently export competitively over a five-year period from 2010 to 2014
- > Identify sustained export opportunities that exists for SA in SSA
- Providing practical insights that will inform future policymaking and planning





#### 1.3 RESEARCH METHOD

Step 1.1

Identifying consistently large and/or growing import demand in SSA for all products (HS6) over a five-year period from 2010 to 2014

Step 1.2

Identifying products which South Africa consistently export competitively (sustainable exports) over a five-year period from 2010 to 2014

Step 2

Matching SSA markets (product-country combinations) with consistently large and/or growing import demand to SA's consistently competitive export supply products

Step 3

Evaluating SA's utilisation of sustained export potential in SSA

	Products exported by South Africa eliminated in step 1.2 (with RCA < 0.7 and RTA < 0)	4,620



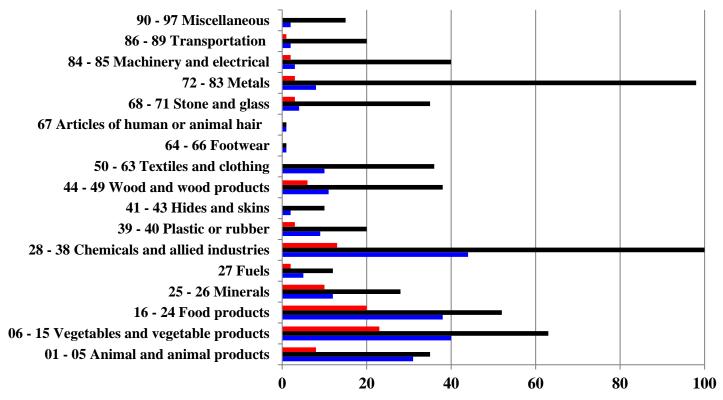

Step 2	Product-country combinations with consistently large and/or growing import demand in SSA (selected in step 1.1)	223
	Products exported by South Africa consistently competitively (i.e. sustainable exports) selected in step 1.2 (with RCA > 0.7 and RTA > 0)	604
	Matched product-country combinations	94
	Product-country combinations eliminated in step 2	129
	Products exported by South Africa consistently competitively (i.e. sustainable exports) eliminated in this step	510





#### Comparison of results obtained in step 1.1, step 1.2 and step 2 at HS2-digit level

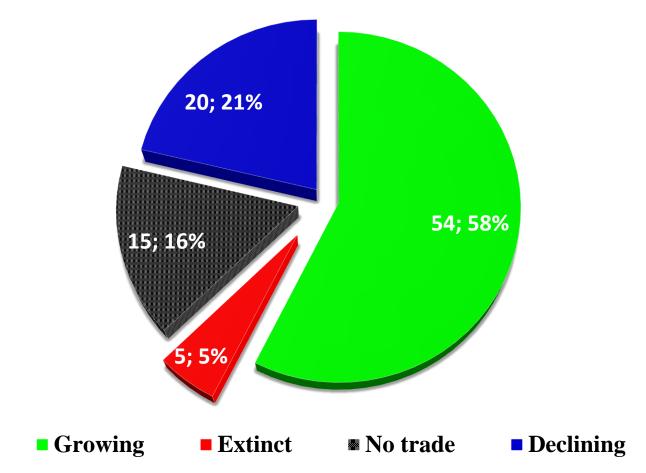


- **■** Matched product-country combinations

- **■** Consistently large and or growing import demand in SSA





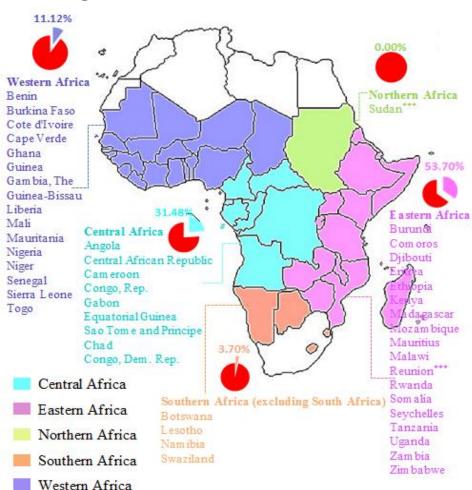
South Africa's utilisation of sustained export potential in SSA (Step 3)



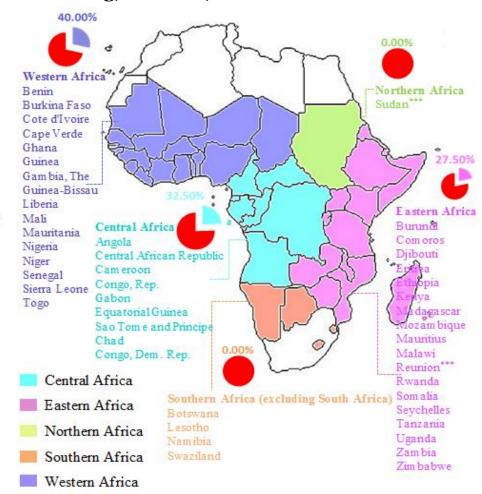

## 1.5 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

#### Conclusions

- > SA is utilising 58% of its sustained export potential in SSA
  - Mostly in Eastern Africa
- > SA is underutilising 21% of its sustained export potential in SSA
- > SA is not utilising at all 21% of its sustained export potential in SSA
  - ✓ Mostly in Central and Western Africa

#### Recommendations

- > Investigating the reasons behind SA's under and non-utilisation of sustained export potential in SSA.
  - ✓ Future firm level research can be undertaken to broaden the understanding of the results obtained in this study.
