SAIELN Business Meeting

(30 April 2017, at O.P. Jindal Global University, Sonipat, Haryana, India) Minutes of the Meeting

- 1. The meeting was moderated by Professor Colin Picker (Associate Dean, University of New South Wales).
- 2. The participants approved the fundamental goals of the South Asia International Economic Law Network (SAIELN), which are broadly set out herein:
 - To encourage in South Asia (broadly defined) the development of:
 - a) academic understandings of the fields of IEL (broadly understood) in a South Asian context, and
 - b) of the different South Asian academic IEL participants (university/college academics and students, academically inclined IEL government/IGO/NGO officials, and academically inclined IEL practitioners).

These goals could be achieved through instigation and support of various IEL activities in South Asia (and outside as relevant) which may include such activities as: conferences; workshops; publications; competitions; relationships with other IEL bodies.
